## **Brief description of the Transnational cooperation:**

1. **Problems to be solved** (justify the need of the transnational cooperation)

In many European countries there is a specific group of unemployed people that is verry hard to reach. This group consists of youngsters that are usually low-skilled or left school early. They do not have the required knowledge and skills to find an employment easily. Often they lack a work ethic as well. Consequently this group of youngsters does not easily find their way to the labour market.

## 2. Objectives to be achieved

The objective is to educate these young people through a training model adjusted to both their own needs and the requirements of the labour market. The training will focus on a specific sector. Because the members of this target group often suffer from concentration difficulties, the training would alternate theoretical subjects and practices with moments of recreation as for example a team building activity or even street dance. The alternation will not only help them keeping their attention during the lessons, but also contributes to their motivation and persistence. The final goal is to teach the unemployed youngsters skills and attitutes which they will need to find of job in the determained sector. An internship at the end of the training should offer them the possibility to practive their skills and knowledge.

Multimedi vzw, a small Belgian company consisting mainly of young enthousiastic enployees, has applyed this adjusted training model in two cities in Belgium using gaming and other activities to encourage the youngsters. The training focussed merely on IT. While one of the two trainings is still ongoing, the other one ended a few months ago and demonstrated encouraging results: five out of eight participants are now working in the IT sector and another one has restarted his education.

3. Main transnational activities (as provisionally planned, to be confirmed with partners)

The aim is to apply a similar training in another European member state facing the same problems trying to activate low educated youngsters. This means that there will be a call towards the target group and youngsters will be selected. They will follow the training and do an internship. The training would preferably focus on IT (because that is the sector we are most familiar with), but does not necessarily have to.

4. Planned outputs, deliverables, results of TNC; expected outcomes (effects)

The result should be double. On the one hand we will disseminate our Flemish experience concerning the training of low educated youngsters abroad. On the other hand every situation and society is different and our partners abroad can help us finalizing our knowledge. Useful and
